We would like to invite you to our Open Day on Saturday 26th November from 9:30am until 11:30am.







Year 4 Outing

Last Thursday year 4 took part in a rainforest habitat workshop at Kew Gardens.

We were very lucky to be the only school group on site and had the entire Palm House to ourselves. The children had an opportunity to investigate and compare the moisture in the soil and the air, inside and outside the tropical Palm House. We learnt about how the humid climate shapes the way plants have evolved and also how they survive in the dark depths of the forest floor, where they receive a very small amount of light. The children explored food chains and marvelled at the weird and wonderful plants.

Inter House Football Last Tuesday The White House children participated in their annual Football House Competition.

The tournament was split into two different competitions, the first involving Years 1, 2 and 3, whilst the latter involved Years 4, 5 and 6. Both competitions featured some excellent football, with a special mention to the girls who throughout both tournaments showed some superb football skills.
