Day Nursery

Over the half term the Bunnies and Foxes have continued their Outer Space theme. Foxes and Bunnies have been looking at pictures of the different planets in non-fiction books about space.

During circle time we discussed the planets in our solar system and how some of the planets are hot and some are cold. With the help of the Foxes we have created a papier-mache mobile of the solar system which can be seen hanging in the Foxes classroom. Additionally, the Bunnies and Foxes have had the opportunity to make their very own space rockets and aliens from outer space. As a nursery we have designed a large space rocket together which we have used for trips to and from the moon. We have also created an exciting outer space sensory bin which has been used for introducing the Bunnies to new vocabulary whilst they explored different textures.

The outer space themed book we have been reading with Bunnies and Foxes is "Goodnight Spaceman". It is a delightful book which tells the story of two children that dream of joining their father on his adventures in space. In addition to this, we have been singing songs such as "Zoom zoom zoom" and "Five little men in a flying saucer" to consolidate the children's counting skills.
